

ROAD SAFETY STRATEGY

A call for your ideas to work towards safer roads for you

We are calling on Cape Town road users to work with the City of Cape Town in formulating ideas and solutions to improve road safety and traffic calming challenges for both pedestrians and motorists.

The focus is on three themes:

- Theme 1 - Road safety for pedestrians and other non-motorised road transport users
- Theme 2 - Road safety for passengers
- Theme 3 - Road safety for motorists

Did you know?

In 2021 alone, over 55 000 road traffic crashes affected Cape Town residents, resulting in it being identified as a challenge.

Annually, more than 700 lives are lost and 7 000 people are injured on Cape Town's roads, with over 70% of these occurring on national, regional and main roads.

400 to 500 pedestrians lose their lives on our roads annually, comprising 60% to 70% of all road fatalities.

How can you help?

Innovators, researchers, entrepreneurs, residents, academic institutions and businesses can submit their ideas via the City's Collaboration Platform until 10 December 2023, which will help us work towards creating safer roads for all.
